### SECTION 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

**Primary:** Skin

#### ACUTE

**Eyes:** May cause eye irritation. Produced slight, reversible conjunctival irritation in rabbits.

**Skin:** Prolonged exposure may cause skin irritation. Produced an average primary skin irritation score of 0.08 in rabbits. Not a dermal sensitizer to guinea pigs.

**Ingestion:** Acute oral toxicity (rats) LD<sub>50</sub> = 4,730 mg/kg

**Inhalation:** Not likely due to the product being pressurized and producing particles large enough not to be respirable. Acute inhalation toxicity (rats) LC<sub>50</sub> > 7.4 mg/L. A few cases of extrinsic asthma from pyrethrin mixtures have been reported. Prolonged exposure may cause drying of nose and throat.

#### CHRONIC / CARCINOGENICITY

Neither this product nor any of its ingredients are classified as carcinogens by the National Toxicity Program (NTP), the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) or the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).

### SECTION 12. ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION

This product is toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.
